## Rural retreat

The picturesque Cotswolds village of Broadway is a perfect place for a getaway at any time of the year and a great place to stay is the gorgeous and understated Russell's.

William Morris was a regular visitor to Russell's furniture workshop and the fascinating Gordon Russell museum lies just off the High Street and a branch of the Ashmolean Museum has recently opened in the village.

Arriving after a long journey one Sunday evening, we were warmly greeted by staff who led us upstairs to our stunning loft room, overlooking the High Street and the Cotswold Hills. Never mind one night, we could have stayed a week in this sumptuous room, which featured a super king size bed, a seating area with two armchairs, flat screen TV and a beautiful natural stone bathroom with freestanding bath and large shower.

It has a modern, airy restaurant, which leads onto an informal courtyard through large glass doors. Seven luxuriously appointed bedrooms
